During October 17–18, 2025, Ovidius University of Constanța organized the 3rd edition of the *Ovidian Doctorals*, an event that has already become a tradition in the academic calendar, dedicated to promoting doctoral research, the exchange of ideas, and interdisciplinary collaboration.

The 3rd edition of the Ovidian Doctoral Conference brought to the forefront Doctoral Research under the lens of standards: what do we write? what do we report? how? when? how much? The dialogue session, moderated by Ana-Maria Popa (Popescu) PhD, brought together for a first roundtable Professors Elena Condrea (Vice-Rector responsible for research, development, and relationship with the Institute of Doctoral Studies), lonela Munteanu (Director of the Research and Innovation Management Department), and Elena Danteş (Coordinator of the Ad Augusta project). The guests discussed the challenges of scientific reporting, best practices, requirements, and the ethics of scientific reporting in doctoral research.

Another topic discussed in the plenary session, within the Doctoral Forum, was **Artificial Intelligence in doctoral research: Tips and Tricks**, presented in the form of a workshop led by Roxana Patraş (*Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iaşi*) and Adrian Vidraşcu (*Ion Mincu* University of Architecture and Urbanism). The workshop provided participants with practical tools for the responsible use of Al technologies in academic writing and analysis, emphasizing the role of digital innovation and the ethical challenges in the development of modern research.

Entitled **Doctoral Mobilities in the ARTEMIS Era: New Challenges, New Opportunities**, the roundtable, moderated by PhD student Andreea Simion, featured as guests Professor Cristina Duhnea PhD (Department of International Relations, Academic Partnerships, and International Ranking) and PhD students Oana Ursică (Medical Sciences), Ioana-Mihaela Şandru and Augustin-Virgiliu Petcu (Philology), Ana-Maria Săcuiu and Andreea Raluca Toma Moise (Management), and Andreea Spînu (Sports Science and Physical Education). They shared experiences and perspectives on the benefits of international training and the new opportunities offered by mobility programs through the Erasmus+ UOC office.





















The Ovidian Doctoral School also hosted a dissemination event for the Erasmus+ project Digital Language and Communication Training for EU Scientists. Assoc. Prof. Alina Buzatu PhD, Dean of the Faculty of Letters and facilitator, together with Prof. Monica Vlad PhD, of the DILAN online scientific communication course, presented the European DILAN Project - how do we communicate science? The genres of scientific discourse, tools of epistemic authority. The lecture offered a broad perspective on how scientific language can become a bridge between specialists and the general public.

The round table From Research to Social Impact: The Role of the Researcher in Promoting Knowledge moderated by Prof. Monica Vlad PhD, featured guests Dr. Oana Carciu (University of Zaragoza), Assoc. Prof. Cătălin Pavel PhD (Ovidius University of Constanța), and Senior Researcher Roxana Patraș (Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iași). They discussed the researcher's responsibility in transforming science into accessible and relevant knowledge for the community, the impact of digitalization on transmitting knowledge to the general public, visibility and social impact, which are sensitive topics in the contemporary world.

At the same time, a series of communications dedicated to this European project were carried out within the DILAN Panel -Online Science Communication, moderated by lect. Oana Carciu PhD (University of Zaragoza). During the session, the way research can be effectively communicated in the digital environment was explored. Participants analyzed how the DILAN course, specially designed within this project to help young researchers acquire, through interdisciplinary, peer-to-peer learning, the skills necessary for developing new digital forms of online science communication, can become a sustainable training tool.

PARTICIPATIONS IN CONFERENCES AND CONGRESSES



Between October 9-11, 2025, doctoral students Otilia-Ana Lungu, Ana-Maria Săcuiu, Andreea-Raluca Moise-Toma, Ștefan-Daniel Florea, Dragos Gruia, Bianca Elena Miron, and Isabelle-Ana-Maria Vîlsan from the **Doctoral School of Management** represented Ovidius University of Constanța at the 2nd edition of the International Conference on Economics - Challenges and Opportunities, held in Predeal. Under the guidance of Prof. . Angela-Eliza Micu PhD, Prof. Elena Condrea PhD, and Prof. Norina Popovici PhD, they presented papers addressing current topics resources management, organizational culture, European agriculture, and the Romanian medical system. The conference, organized by Bucharest University of Economic Studies in partnership with 39 universities and research institutes from Romania and abroad (including Ovidius University of Constanța), brought together over 340 participants and 207 scientific papers.

From July 12 to September 26, 2025, at the MIFA Gallery (Masters of Illustration and Animated Film) in Bucharest, the tribute exhibition lordan Chimet, titled Lamento for Baltazar the Little Fish, took place, featuring illustrations created by Teodora Şooş, a PhD student at the Doctoral School of Philology. Inspired by Iordan Chimet's eponymous poem, the artist explored the surreal universe of the text through a series of mixed media works, in which playfulness, symbolism, and visual fantasy intertwine.

Iulia Tudorache-Arfire, a secondyear PhD student at the **Doctoral** School of Philology, participated on October 25, 2025, in the International Conference Language, Literature and Cultural Policies, organized by the University of Craiova, where she presented the paper Oscillating Futures: Feminist Science Fiction at the Tradition Crossroads of and Metamodernity.

Nicoleta Însurățelu, a doctoral student at the **Doctoral School of History**, participated scientific events organized by the Bucharest Municipality Museum. Between October 16-17, 2025, she paper presented the Functional Elegance of Some Minor Architectural Elements in 1900" at the first edition of Pinacoteca working pavilion, held at the Filipescu-Cesianu House (Museum of Ages), and also presented the paper "Plumbuita and Kurşunlu, Technical from Solutions Cultural-Urban Tradition" at the edition of the Urban Anthropology Symposium, with the theme "Sensory Urban Cartographies: Images, Smells, Sounds, Textures."



ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS



Between October 15-18, 2025, doctoral students Lavinia Bodeanu Andreea-Dalila Nedelcu from the **Doctoral School of Medicine** won the 3rd Prize and an Honorable Mention, respectively, at the 48th Annual National Congress Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, organized by the Romanian Society of Medical Rehabilitation in Poiana Brașov, an event that brought together over 900 participants from across the country.

The distinctions were awarded for the works:

Therapeutic challenges of betablocker medication in the context of medical rehabilitation – Lavinia Bodeanu:

Exploratory pilot study: effects of strength training, determined by bioimpedance, in twins – Andreea-Dalila Nedelcu. The research was conducted within the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, under the coordination of Associate Professor Liliana-Elena Stanciu and Professor Mădălina-Gabriela liescu.

Denisa-Gabriela Ion-Andrei, a doctoral student at the **Doctoral School of Medicine**, under the supervision of Prof. Elena Dantes PhD, participated in the autumn of 2025 in two scientific events dedicated to research in pulmonology. At the *State-of-the-Art in Pulmonology Conference – Between Tradition and Innovation* (Cluj-Napoca, September 18–20), she presented the paper *The Blood Signature in Lung Cancer*, regarding the role of hematological markers and the ECOG score in the prognosis of lung cancer. At the Pulmonology Circle of SRP Education for Performance (Bucharest, October 10–11), she gave the presentation *From Imaging to Survival*, which explores the correlations between clinical, imaging parameters, and the survival of patients with bronchopulmonary cancer.


